This position is intended to enhance the existing child and youth program by offering more children's activities to children and youth. The Residential Child and Youth Worker Summer Student will demonstrate a commitment to the provision of excellent client services and contribute to a respectful, productive work environment at Cornerstone.

Summary of Duties & Responsibilities

1. Program Planning and Client Services
 - To work collaboratively within an interdisciplinary team to assess the needs of individual children and families
 - To develop and implement programs and activities for children and youth in the shelter
 - To provide parent relief
 - Provide consultation, support and education to families
 - Demonstrate healthy child development behavior management techniques
 - To maintain ongoing contact with the Manager of Residential Services to ensure quality of service to children and youth and families in the shelter
2. Community Relations
